1. Walk from the church door towards the car park, and look for the tombstone of Thomas Barnham, who was a well-sinker. What is shown carved on the stone?
 2. The FONT in a church is usually positioned near the entrance to the building. Why do you think this is? Round the bowl, some panels have carved angels holding shields. These show the arms of the Trinity, the sacraments, (three chalices with wafers), the three crowns of East Anglia, and the Instruments of the Passion. This last one shows things that were used when Jesus was crucified. Look for the Cross on the panel and write down the names of some of the other things shown on it.
 3. Find the First World War Roll of Honour. Whose is the fourth name down on the left-hand side?

8. In the east window are two small pictures of Evangelists, an angel for Matthew and an eagle for John. They were originally part of a series of four. Who are the other two, or what emblems did they have? (Think of the start of the New Testament, or go and look again at the font!)
 9. Look at the Mothers' Union banner in the sanctuary. What is the flower in its centre, and why?
 10. In the north window of the chancel, an angel swings a censer. For what was it used?
 11. In the north aisle is the Good Samaritan window. Quotations from the story are underneath the main pictures .What does the inscription say beneath the right-hand panel?
